

Below is a list of inhabitants from the manorial roll of 1765, transcribed by Alan Forsdick. By reference to the 1778 enclosure award 'Tho Brierley' is Theophilus and 'Huchington' is Hutchinson. Maybe also 'Eaton' could be Exon ?

ADMINISTRATION

In the 17th and 18th century, Hathern was part of the Shepshed Manor. The Rolls for 1675, 1765; 1790 - 1800 are held in the Derbyshire Recods Office (Matlock). The Rolls for 1798/9 are in too delicate a condition to be read. None of the Rolls have been transcribed.

In 1765 the Lord of the Manor was Sir William Gordon and this is the list of Hathern inhabitants according to the 'Suit Roll'.....

 The Jury consisted of Wm Boyer Sen; Wm Boyer Jnr; Thomas Exon; Thms Harriman; John Berrington.

The Manorial Records for Hathern in its own right from 1858 to 1909 are held in the Leicester Records Office (Wigston) Ref DE1137.

In 1858 Thomas Brooks is appointed 'pindar' there is a list of people renting 'Tenements on the Waste'. Ground rules for behaviour in the village are established and posted on the church door.....

- concern for fire prevention
- no carrying of fire from house to house
- chimneys to be kept in good repair
- no smoking in outbuildings
- no fires in the streets.
