

HATHERN ENCLOSURE AWARD 1777/1778

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In the following sections, everything in normal black text is a full and sequential transcription of the Award. All text in red has been added to aid understanding.

Introduction

Appointment of Commissioners. TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, WE, William Wyatt of Burton upon Trent in the county of Stafford, Thomas Oldknow of the Town of Nottingham and John Smith of Packington in the counties of Leicester and Derby,

Scope and date of the Act of Enclosure. Gentlemen, send greeting WHEREAS, by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the seventeenth year of the reign of his present Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for dividing and inclosing the open fields, meadows, pastures, commons or waste grounds within the Lordship or Liberty and Parish of HATHERNE in the County of Leicester". RECITING That there are, within the said Lordship or Liberty and parish of Hatherne, several open fields, meadows, pastures, and parcels of common or waste ground computed to contain, in the whole, one thousand three hundred acres or thereabouts.

Rights of Hatherne Church. And further reciting that Sir William Gordon Knight of the Bath (in right of Dame Mary Gordon his wife) is Lord of the Manor and patron of the Rectory of Hatherne aforesaid, and that the Reverend William Middleton clerk is Rector of the said Rectory and, as such, is intituled to certain Glebe lands and common right in the said open fields, meadows, pastures, commons and waste grounds, and to a certain piece of Land called the Tithe Piece, and to a cottage with common right belonging thereto and to all the great and small tithes belonging to the said Rectory, except the tithe of hay of some part of the said meadows.

Rights of Curacy of Osmaston. AND further reciting that the Reverend Joseph Smith, clerk curate of the chapel of Osmaston in the County of Derby is intituled to certain lands and right of common within the said Lordship and Parish of Hatherne as belonging to the said Chapel and Curacy of Osmaston.

Rights of Christ's College Cambridge and sub-lessees. And that the Master, Fellows and Scholars of Christ's College in the University of Cambridge are intitled to certain lands within the said Lordship of Hatherne. And that Richard Cheslyn Esquire is Lessee thereof under the said Master, Fellows and Scholars. And that Thomas Exon, John Exon, Thomas Harriman, Samuel Bowley, Samuel Smith, John Wale, William Martin and others are sub-lessees or under-tenants of the of the same lands to the said Richard Cheslyn.

Rights of Wigston Hospital and sub-lessees. And that the Chaplains and Poor of the Hospital of William Wigston in the Town of Leicester of the foundation of the same William are ALSO intitled to certain lands in the said Lordship of Hatherne. And that William Martin, Thomas Exon, Joseph Halford, Samuel Smith, and Alice Lowe (Widow) are lessees thereof under the said Chaplains and Poor of the said Hospital

Rights of other owners. And that the Right Honourable Francis Earl of Huntingdon, the said Sir William Gordon, Joseph Halford, Alice Lowe, Thomas Bowley, Samuel Bowley, William Boyer and others are the owners and proprietors of the residue of the said open fields, meadows, pastures, commons or waste grounds intended by the said Act to be divided and inclosed.

Land will be allocated according to rights. AND further reciting that the lands in the said open fields lye intermixed and dispersed in small parcels and that it would be very advantageous to the several persons interested if the said fields, meadows, pastures, commons or waste grounds were divided and inclosed and specific parts and shares thereof allotted to them according to their several and respective shares, rights and interests therein.

Land will be allocated according to rules. IT IS THEREFORE ENACTED that all the lands and grounds in the said open fields, meadows, pastures, commons or waste grounds shall be divided, set out, allotted and inclosed in the manner and

subject to the rules, orders and directions in the said Act contained respecting the same AND that we, the said William Wyatt, Thomas Oldknow and John Smith and our successors to be elected in manner in the said Act mentioned, are thereby appointed Commissioners for dividing and allotting the said open fields, meadows, pastures, commons or waste grounds and for putting the said Act in execution.

A survey will be carried out. AND it is further Enacted that all the lands, grounds and commons within the said Parish should be surveyed by John Bailey of the Town of Nottingham aforesaid or such other person or persons as we, the said Commissioners, should appoint. And that in such survey the number of acres, roods and perches belonging to each proprietor in the said open fields and meadows, and ALSO, the number of acres, roods and perches contained in the whole of the said lands and grounds should be therein ascertained and so forth. And that said survey and plan should be laid before the said Commissioners.

Procedure for allocating to Church. AND it is further ENACTED that we, the said Commissioners, shall in the first place set out, assign and allot unto the said William Middleton and his successors, Rector of the said Parish of Hatherne

- such part of the lands and grounds intended to be inclosed as shall (quantity and quality considered) be equal in value to the glebe land, tithe piece and common right in the said lands so to be inclosed belonging to the said William Middleton as Rector as aforesaid
- And ALSO, to allot unto the said William Middleton and his successors, Rectors as aforesaid (after the public roads therein mentioned are set out) such part of the residue of the lands and grounds to be inclosed as (quantity quality and situation to be considered) shall, in the judgement of us the said Commissioners, be equal in value to one seventh part of such residue as is subject to tithes

- And, ALSO, such further part of the then residue of the lands to be inclosed as (quantity, quality and situation considered) shall, in the judgement of us, the said Commissioners, be equal in value to one tenth part of the present ancient inclosures within the said Parish of Hatherne as are subject to pay tithes
- Which said allotments so to be made to the said William Middleton and his successors Rectors as aforesaid, IT IS thereby Enacted, shall be in lieu of and full satisfaction as well for all his and their Glebe lands, tithe piece and right of common in the said open fields, meadows, pastures, commons or waste grounds, as ALSO, for all and all manner of rectorial or other tithes and ecclesiastical dues and payments of every sort and kind arising, happening or renewing, or that may be claimed by the said Rector or his successors in right of the said Rectory within the said lands and grounds intended to be inclosed as aforesaid
- and for all manner of tithes and other ecclesiastical dues whatsoever arising from, or payable out of, all or any of the gardens orchards and old inclosed grounds within the said Lordship of Hatherne, except Mortuaries, Easter dues and surplice fees.

Procedure for allocating to Lord of Manor. AND it is further ENACTED that we the said Commissioners shall, in the next place, allot to the said Sir William Gordon as Lord of the Manor of Hatherne aforesaid

- **Oakley Wood Strip:** a Meer or Freeboard of so many yards in breadth as the said Commissioners shall think fit extending by the side of Oakley Wood in the said open fields the length of the said wood as a proper satisfaction to the said Sir William Gordon as Lord of the said Manor for his right and interest in and to the soil of the said commons or waste lands intended to be inclosed
- **Land for quarrying:** ALSO, to appoint out of the residue of the said open fields, meadows, pastures, commons or waste grounds one or more piece or pieces of ground

containing two acres or thereabouts in such convenient place or places near the Town of Hatherne as we the said Commissioners shall think proper for getting gravel and stone for repairing the public roads and ways to be set out as thereafter is, directed and for, the use of the inhabitants of the Town of Hatherne aforesaid

Procedure for allocating to Curacy of Osmaston. AND it is further ENACTED that we, the said Commissioners, shall allot unto the said Joseph Smith and his successors as Curates of the Chapel and Curacy of Osmaston aforesaid such part of the residue of the said open fields, meadows, pastures, commons and waste grounds as shall in the judgement of us, the said Commissioners, be a full equivalent for his and their right and interest in and to the same, after a deduction of

- so much as shall in the judgement of us, the said Commissioners, be equal in value to his proportion of the expences of the outside mounding or fencing such allotment or allotments
- and of the expences incident to the obtaining and executing the said Act
- and such other expences as are thereafter directed to be paid for him by the rest of the proprietors of lands in the said grounds intended to be inclosed

Procedure for allocating to all other bodies and persons. AND it is further ENACTED that, after making the several allotments aforesaid, we the said commissioners shall set out, assign and allot the residue of the said open fields, meadows, pastures, commons or waste grounds unto and amongst the said Francis Earl of Huntingdon, Sir William Gordon, the said Master Fellows and Scholars of Christs College, the said chaplains and poor of Wigston's Hospital, Joseph Halford, Alice Lowe, Thomas Bowley, Samuel Bowley, William Bowley and the several other persons who are owners or proprietors of lands, grounds and right of common in the said open fields, meadows,

pastures, commons or waste grounds in proportion to their several shares rights and interests therein

Compensation. AND IT IS further Enacted that, in case any person or persons shall, at the time of such allotments being made as aforesaid, be possessed of any of the present inclosed lands within the said Lordship of Hatherne who shall not be possessed of sufficient lands within the said grounds to be enclosed, as aforesaid, out of which such allotment can be made, as aforesaid, in lieu of the great and small tithes of such present old inclosed lands respectively, then that the person or persons who shall be possessed of such present inclosed lands shall pay unto such person or persons and, at such time or times, as we the said commissioners shall appoint, such sum or sums of money as, we the said Commissioners shall think, a full satisfaction for the great and small tithes of the said present inclosed lands, and that such sum or sums of money shall be applied towards paying the expences incident to the obtaining the said Act and the other necessary expences incurred by us, the said Commissioners, in the execution thereof

Commissioners will specify roads and ditches. AND it is further Enacted that we, the said Commissioners, shall appoint both public and private ways or roads through the said lands and grounds to be inclosed, and shall set out for the said Sir William Gordon a road or way from certain ancient inclosures in the Liberty of Thorpe Acre and Dishley called the Boat Acres, Hillocky Closes, Soar Meadow and Moors to the Town of Hatherne aforesaid, and from the said Meer or Freeboard to be set out as aforesaid adjoining to Oakley Wood to the public highways leading from Hatherne to Belton and from Hatherne to Shepshead in the said County of Leicester. And that all the public carriage roads to be set out shall be sixty feet broad at the least between the ditches. And ALSO, that we, the said commissioners, may direct public and private ditches, drains, bridges, gates and stiles to be made in and upon the said lands and grounds intended to be inclosed. And that all public and private bridle roads and footways to be set out as aforesaid,

and all public and private ditches, drains, bridges, gates and stiles, as shall be so directed to be made as aforesaid, shall be made and, from time to time, repaired at the expence of such of the said proprietors and in such manner as we, the said Commissioners, shall direct.

Rules for exchange of ownership. And for the more convenient situation of the several estates within the said Parish of Hatherne, it is further ENACTED that it shall be lawful for us, the said commissioners, and we are thereby impowered, to set out, allot and appoint any house, barn or other building or the whole or any part of any ancient inclosed lands within the said Parish of Hatherne in exchange for any other house, barn or building, or for other lands lying in the said grounds intended to be inclosed, or in exchange for any old inclosed lands or grounds within the said Parish of Hatherne so as all such exchanges be ascertained, specified and declared in the Award thereby directed to be made, and so as every such exchange be made with the consent of the Proprietors interested therein who shall have any estate of inheritance in fee simple, fee tail, or be tenants for life or lives of, or in, such estates to be testified under their respective hands and seals. And there is contained in the said Act a proviso that no exchange shall be made of or any of the houses, barns, buildings or ancient inclosures belonging to the said Chaplains and poor or their Lessees as such without the consent of the said Chaplains and Poor testified under their usual or common seal.

Responsibility for repair of hedges, ditches and fences. AND it is further ENACTED that all the hedges, ditches and fences to be made for inclosing and dividing the said lands shall, at all times hereafter, be repaired by, and at the expence of such person and persons and in such manner, as we the said Commissioners shall by our Award direct. AND it is thereby further ENACTED that the expences of ditching, hedging and fencing the lands and grounds to be allotted for the Master, Fellows and scholars of Christs College and their successors or the said Richard Cheslyn as their Lessee, and to and for the

said Chaplains and Poor of Wigston's Hospital aforesaid or any of their lessees shall be paid by their respective lessees under-tenants and farmers in proportion to their respective shares in such lands and grounds which shall be so allotted for the said Master, Fellows and Scholars of Christ's College aforesaid and their successors or the said Richard Cheslyn as their lessee, and the said chaplains and poor of Wigston's Hospital aforesaid or any of their lessees in such manner as we the said Commissioners shall direct.

Hatherne Church and Osmaston exempt from cost of fencing.

AND there is contained in the said Act a Proviso that the said William Middleton and his successors, Rectors of Hatherne, and the said Joseph Smith and his successors, Curates of Osmaston as aforesaid, shall not be at any expence in making the ring fences of the lands and grounds to be allotted to them, but that the several allotments to be made to the said William Middleton and Joseph Smith and to be set out for getting gravel and stone shall, within twelve calendar months next after executing our Award, be inclosed and fenced and the expence of the ring fences paid by the several other proprietors of the lands intended to be inclosed in such proportions as we the said Commissioners shall direct.

What will be in the final award? AND it is thereby further ENACTED that, as soon as conveniently may be after we the said Commissioners shall have completed the said allotments of the lands intended to be inclosed, WE, or any two of us, shall prepare' or cause to be prepared, an Award or Instrument in writing which shall express the quantity in statute measure of acres, roods and perches contained in the said lands and grounds intended to be inclosed, and the quantity of each parcel thereof allotted to, or exchanged with, each proprietor intituled to the same and a description of the situation, buttals and boundaries of the same allotments respectively, with proper orders and directions for fencing the same allotments and for making and laying out the public and private roads,

ways and passages in and through, the same, and shall ALSO, express such other orders, regulations and determinations as shall be proper and necessary to be inserted therein conformable to the purport of the said Act. And that the said Award shall be ingrossed on Parchment and signed and sealed by us the said Commissioners, or any two of us, and inrolled as in the said Act is directed. And that the several allotments, divisions or exchanges and all orders, directions, regulations and determinations so to be made, as aforesaid, in and by such Award or instrument shall be final, binding and conclusive unto and upon all persons intitled to, or claiming, any lands or other property in the said open fields, grounds and commons.

Existing agreements terminated. AND it is further Enacted that all and every lease and leases at rack or extended rent subsisting of all or any part of the said lands and grounds intended to be inclosed, and all other agreements at rack or extended rent for any term therein shall, immediately upon such divisions or allotments being made and such Award or instrument executed as aforesaid, or so soon after as we the said Commissioners or any two of us shall by our award or instrument appoint, cease, determine and be void, the respective lessees or landlord of such lands and grounds making such satisfaction to their respective lessee or lessees, under-tenant or tenants as we, the said Commissioners, or any two of us, shall ascertain as reasonable to be paid to such lessee or lessees, tenant or tenants as an equivalent for the same as in, and by, the said recited Act reference being thereunto had may more fully and at large appear.

Notice of meetings in the Leicester newspaper. AND WHEREAS we, the said William Wyatt, Thomas Oldknow and John Smith, have taken upon ourselves the execution of the powers and authorities vested in us by the said recited Act of Parliament and, according to the directions therein contained, have given public notice in the Leicester Newspaper of the time and place of our first and every subsequent meeting held pursuant thereto (meetings by adjournment only excepted).

Oaths have been taken and Survey completed and assessed

- **Oath by Commissioners.** AND WHEREAS each of us, the said William Wyatt, Thomas Oldknow and John Smith before our acting as Commissioners in the execution of the powers by the said Act to us given have severally taken and subscribed the Oath therein directed (which oaths so taken and subscribe by us respectively are annexed to this our award)
- **Survey carried out.** AND WHEREAS we have caused all the lands grounds and commons within the said Lordship and parish of Hatherne to be surveyed and planned by the said John Bailey, and such survey and plan containing the number of acres roods and perches belonging to each proprietor and ALSO, the number of acres, roods and perches contained in the whole of the said lands and grounds being therein ascertained and set forth has been laid before us, the said Commissioners, at all our meetings held subsequent to the making the said survey and plan
- **Oath by Surveyer.** AND WHEREAS the said John Bailey did, before he delivered the said survey and plan to us the said Commissioners, take and subscribe the oath by the said act directed to be taken by the person appointed surveyor (which oath so taken and subscribed by the said John Bailey is ALSO, hereto annexed)
- **Survey considered.** AND WHEREAS we, the said commissioners, have perused and well considered the said survey and plan together with the quantities, qualities and situation of the said lands and grounds therein contained and frequently viewed the said fields and other lands and grounds intended by the said Act to be divided and inclosed.

Rights have been properly considered. And we have ALSO, heard and duly informed ourselves of the rights and claims of

all the Parties interested in the same open fields, meadows, commons or waste grounds, and to the best of our knowledge and judgement, settled and determined the same and all other matters and things relating to the said intended inclosure and the ancient inclosed grounds and other hereditaments in Hatherne aforesaid intended by the said Act to be exonerated from the payment of all manner of tithes

People to whom the land is to be allocated. AND WHEREAS it appears to us by the said survey and plan that the said lands and grounds intended by the said Act to be divided and inclosed contain in the whole one thousand two hundred and fifty acres two roods and five perches or thereabouts. And that the said Sir William Gordon, William Middleton (as Rector as aforesaid), Joseph Smith (as Curate of the Chapel of Osmaston as aforesaid) the Master Fellows and Scholars of Christs College in the University of Cambridge. the said Chaplains and poor of Wigston's Hospital in the Town of Leicester, the Right Honourable Francis Earl of Huntingdon, Joseph Halford, Alice Lowe, Thomas Bowley, Samuel Bowley the elder, William Boyer, and ALSO, John Aynsworth, Thomas Bailey, John Black, Elizabeth Bowley spinster , (*blank*) Wood widow, Samuel Bowley the younger, George Burton, Francis Burnett, Theophilus Brearley, Susanna Bennett (Widow), George Bennett, Robert Buckley, John Buckley (of Bagworth), Thomas Calverley, John Caudwell, the Feoffees or Trustees for certain lands called the Church lands, Robert Cumberland, Ann Callise (widow), John Dickman, and George Cooper, Edward Dean, William Day, Stephen Dummelow, Elizabeth Freeman (widow), Charles Freeman, William Halford, Robert Hutchinson, Thomas Harriman, John Harriman, Jonathan Kirk, Robert Langdale, Ann Langdale (Spinster), Daniel Leeson, John Long, William Minion, Samuel Marriott, William Pollard, Richard Pulteney, the Overseers of the Poor of Long Whatton, Richard Quinton, Thomas Richards Esquire, and John Buckley (of Normanton), Samuel Smith, Elizabeth Shaw (Widow), Isaac Swift, William Swift, Thomas West, Catherine Warren (Widow), William

Warren, William Walker, and Edward Wallace, the present owners and proprietors of the said lands and grounds so intended to be inclosed.

Requirements of Act have been met. AND WHEREAS we have maturely and impartially considered the several other matters and things referred to us by the said Act and have finished and, completed the Partition and division of the lands and grounds so directed to be divided and inclosed by the said recited, NOW KNOW YE that we, the said William Wyatt, Thomas Oldknow and John Smith HAVE, in pursuance of the powers and authorities given to and vested in us by the said recited Act of Parliament, set out, assigned and allotted And, by this our Award or instrument in writing signed and sealed by us the said Commissioners, in obedience to and further pursuance of the directions of the said Act, DO set out assign and allot All and singular the open fields, meadows, pastures, commons or waste grounds within the Lordship or Liberty and Parish of Hatherne aforesaid intended by the said act to be divided and inclosed, containing by statute measure one thousand two hundred and fifty acres, two roods and five perches as aforesaid or thereabouts in such manner and to such person and persons subjects to the rules, orders, provisions and directions by the said Act ordered, directed, provided, established, and prescribed, of, and concerning, the same and with such descriptions of the situation, buttals and boundaries of the same allotments respectively as are hereinafter mentioned beginning with the eastward boundary of each allotment. and proceeding from thence to the southward boundary and from the southward to the westward boundary and from the westward to the northward boundary thereof.

There is a plan with numbered plots. All which allotments and boundaries will more fully appear by a plan of the same to this our Award annexed in which said plan, as well as in this our Award, each allotment is numbered in order the better to ascertain the same (that is to say).

Allocation to "Special" People

THE REVD WILLIAM MIDDLETON AS RECTOR

Plot 42. IN THE FIRST PLACE, WE, the said Commissioners, do set out assign and allot under the said WILLIAM MIDDLETON and his successors Rectors of the said Parish of Hatherne for the time being All that plot or parcel of land lying in a certain place called the Midsummer Ground and the Pasture adjoining containing by statute measure three acres two roods and thirty-five perches or thereabouts marked in the said plan No.42 and bounded

- by lands hereby allotted to the said Joseph Halford No. 49
- by a private carriage road leading from Hatherne aforesaid into a place called Nether Meadow
- by ancient homesteads in Hatherne aforesaid,
- by lands hereby allotted to the said Elisabeth Shaw No. 41, and
- by lands hereby allotted to the said Sir William Gordon No. 40.

And we do hereby order and direct that all the fences for inclosing the said plot or parcel of land so allotted to the said William Middleton and his successors, Rectors as aforesaid (except on the northward side against the allotment No. 41) shall be made by, and at the expence of, the several owners and proprietors of the said lands intended to be inclosed (except the said William Middleton as Rector as aforesaid and the said Joseph Smith as Curate of Chapel of Osmaston as aforesaid) according to the directions of the said Act. And that the said fences when so made shall at all times thereafter for ever be kept and repaired by the said William Middleton and his successors Rectors as aforesaid

Plot 8. ALSO, we do set out assign and allot unto the said William Middleton and his successors (Rectors of the said Parish of Hatherne for the time being) All that other plot or parcel of land part thereof lying in a field called Oakley Field

and the residue in another field called Dales Field containing by statute measure sixty-nine acres three roods and five perches or thereabouts marked on the said Plan No. 8 and bounded

- by the turnpike road leading from Loughborough to Derby
- by lands hereby allotted to the said Alice Lowe No. 7,
- by other lands hereby allotted to the said William Middleton in lieu of tithes No. 3
- by the turnpike road leading from Coleorton to Rempston
- by lands hereby allotted to the said William Pollard No. 9 and
- by lands hereby allotted to the said Robert Buckley No. 34

And we do hereby order and direct that the fences for inclosing the last above described allotment on the east against the said turnpike road leading from Loughborough to Derby on the south against the allotment No. 7 and against the said turnpike road leading from Coleorton to Rempston and against the said allotment No. 9 shall be made by and at the expence of the several owners and proprietors of the lands intended to be inclosed (except the said William Middleton as Rector as aforesaid and the said Joseph Smith as Curate of the Chapel of Osmaston as aforesaid) according to the directions of the said Act. And that the said fences, when so made, shall at all times thereafter for ever be kept in repair by the said William Middleton and his successors, Rectors of Hatherne, as aforesaid.

Plots 42 and 8 described above. Which said two allotments made to the said William Middleton contain together seventy-three acres and two roods or thereabouts and are hereby allotted to him and his successors as Rector as aforesaid in lieu of and full satisfaction for his and their Glebe lands, tithe piece and common right in the said lands or grounds so intended to be divided and inclosed.

Plot 3. ALSO, we do set out assign and allot unto the said William Middleton and his successors (Rectors of the said Parish of Hatherne for the time being) ALL that other plot or parcel of land part thereof being in the said Oakley field and

the residue thereof in the said Dales Field, containing by statute measure one hundred and fifty acres one rood and thirty-six perches or thereabouts marked in the said plan No. 3 and bounded

- by other lands hereby allotted to the said William Middleton and his successors No.8,
- by lands hereby allotted to the said Alice Low, No7,
- by a public road called Shepshead road
- by lands hereby allotted to the said Thomas West No.6,
- by lands hereby allotted to the said John Wale No.5,
- by lands hereby allotted in lieu of a moiety of an undivided common called the Rushes belonging to the parishes of Hatherne and Shepshead No.2,
- by a freeboard or meer hereby allotted to the said Sir William Gordon No.1,
- by the liberty of Long Whatton,
- by an allotment hereby made to the proprietors of land and common right in Long Whatton No. 4, and
- by the said turnpike road leading from Coleorton to Rempston

And we do hereby order and direct that the fences for enclosing the last above described allotment against the said allotment No. 7, against the northwest end of the said allotment no. 6, against the said allotment No. 5 , against the Sheapshed road against the allotment No. 2, against the said allotment No. 2, against the said allotment No. 4 and against the said turnpike road leading from Coleorton to Rempston shall ALSO, be made by, and at the expence of, the several owners and proprietors of the lands intended to be inclosed (except the said William Middleton as Rector as aforesaid and the said Joseph Smith as Curate of the Chapel of Osmaston as aforesaid) according to the directions of the said Act. And that the said fences, when so made, shall at all times thereafter for ever be kept in repair by the said William Middleton and his successors Rectors of Hatherne as aforesaid

Plot 58. ALSO, we do set out assign and allot unto the said William Middleton and his successors (Rectors of the said Parish of Hatherne for the time being), All that other plot or parcel of land lying in a certain meadow called the Nether Meadow and the Pasture adjoining containing by statute measure twenty-nine acres one rood and twenty eight perches or thereabouts marked in the said Plan No. 58 and bounded

- by the River Soar,
