

BATHERN is a township and parish in West Goscote Hundred, Loughborough Union, North Leicestershire, on the borders of Nottinghamshire, situated about 3 miles north-west from Loughborough. The living is a rectory, in the patronage of Charles March Phillipps, Esq.; the

rector is the Rev. Edward Thomas March Phillipps, M.A. The church, which is an ancient structure, is dedicated to St. Peter. The parish, in 1831, contained 1,187 inhabitants. C. M. Phillipps, Esq., is lord of the manor. Many of the people are framework knitters.
